

## Cornus sericea f. baileyi RED TWIG DOGWOOD

## RED TWIG DOGWOOD Cornus sericea f. baileyi

A red-stemmed *Cornus* producing a striking winter display when its leaves are absent. This is an excellent garden plant for massed or individual planting in parks or garden shrub borders to enhance winter garden landscapes.

Foliage:	Bluish-green, lustrous leaves up to 12 cm long, turning purplish-red in autumn.
Flowers:	Creamy-white flowers borne in flat-topped cymes up to 6 cm wide in late spring and intermittently through summer.
Fruit:	White drupes up to 7 mm in diameter.
Culture:	Tolerant of a range of conditions but best in moist, well-drained soils. Periodic removal of stems encourages vigorous new coloured stem growth. May be susceptible to canker. Adaptable to temperate areas.
Size:	2.5 x 3 metres.
