## **HONEY-LOCUST**

## Gleditsia triacanthos var. inermis 'Elegantissima'

One of the most underutilised trees available to the ornamental tree market in Australia today. A very interesting small, compact form of Gleditsia that will provide year-round interest. Excellent for use as a specimen or screening tree in gardens, courtyards, carparks and streets.

Foliage: Bright green feathery bipinnate leaves to 16 cm long turning yellow in autumn. The

fallen leaves in autumn are easily cleaned up.

Flowers: Inconspicuous.

Culture:

Fruit: Sparse. Yellow-green to brown-red legume-like pods persist until late in winter.


Adaptable to a wide range of conditions including urban sites, air pollution, saline soil, moderate drought and occasional wetness. Performs best in moist, deep, fertile soils in a full sun position but tolerates periods of heat and drought once established.

Relatively pest and disease free, however overseas reports indicate it may be susceptible to spider mite and leaf spot.
