FLOWERING PEACH

Prunus persica 'Versicolour'

A double flowering peach that can provide an elegant spring display in the smaller home garden or park environment.

Foliage: Light green, lanceolate leaves with a long tapered point.

Flowers: Double flowers with a range of colour forms on the same tree from pale pink (almost

white) to deep pink stripes or solid dark pink. Flowers open early-to-mid sping.


Fruit: Small hard fruit. Inedible.

Culture: Can adapt to various site conditions, but prefers moist, well-drained fertile soils and

a position receiving full sun to part-shade. Flowers best in full sun and when pruned annually, immediately after flowering. Spraying to prevent leaf curl is recommended.

Size: 3 x 3 metres.
