FLOWERING CHERRY

Prunus

'Shirotae' ('Mt. Fuji')

A vigorous, strongly spreading tree with a spectacular, very early floral display. A popular tree in small gardens where lateral space is adequate and tough enough for use in streets and other public open space plantings. One of the Sato-zakura Group (cultivated Japanese cherries).

Foliage: Mid-green leaves with an extended tip and a distinctive finely serrated margin. Turning attractive yellow to bronzy-reddish and orange in autumn. The new growth is pale green.

Flowers: Slightly pink buds opening to white flowers hanging below the branches in pendant clusters in mid-spring. Can be semi-double or double. Mildly fragrant.

Culture: Flowers best in full sun. May suffer some branch dieback when the tree is older and stressed. Best when given adequate lateral space to grow.

Size: 4 x 6 metres.
