WEEPING JAPANESE MAPLE Acer palmatum

'Dissectum Atropurpureum Ornatum'

A popular 'laceleaf' cultivar with excellent foliage colour variation from spring to autumn and a characteristic domed, weeping habit. The brilliant tones stand out well in the landscape. A suitable landscape feature for small protected gardens and parks.

Foliage: Deep red new growth becoming dark coppery-burgundy in spring, then

fades to a bronze-green throughout summer. The autumn colours are usually brilliant orange tones. Deeply incised with seven to nine long, fine

lobes that in turn have serrated lobes.

Flowers: Small, red flowers. Insignificant.

Fruit: Small, red and green samaras in pairs.

Culture: Adaptable to a range of soil types, but prefers a moist, well-drained soil.

Should not be planted in exposed areas where hot summer winds may

stress the tree and leaves may suffer scorch in very hot sun.

Size: 2 x 2 metres.
