BAY LAUREL Laurus nobilis

An evergreen large shrub or small tree with aromatic foliage, that is often used in cooking.

Foliage: Smooth, thick, green leaves are often dried and used as flavouring in

cooking.

Flowers: Small yellow-green flowers are produced at the leaf base.

Fruit: Fruit is formed on female trees only and is a small black drupe containing

a single seed.

Culture: Adaptable to a range of conditions, but prefers moist, well-drained soils.

Tolerant of frost, heat and drought once established. Can be pruned to maintain desired shape and is ideally suited to topiary and hedges.

Forms a small tree if left unpruned.

Size: 6 x 3 metres.
