## PLANE TREE

### *Platanus orientalis var. insularis* 'Autumn Glory'

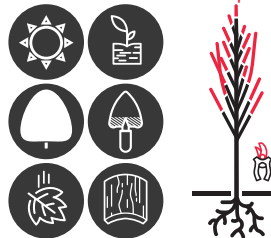
Selected for the intensity of its autumn foliage colour, this attractive tree with deeply incised leaves is excellent as a specimen for larger parks and gardens or as a street and avenue tree where space permits.

- Foliage:** The attractive, deeply cut foliage, is a rich green through spring and summer, turning to rich tones of red and orange-red in autumn.
- Flowers:** Inconspicuous flowers produced in early spring.
- Fruit:** Pendulous seed balls (an aggregate of achenes) to 25 mm diameter are produced in groups of two to six.
- Culture:** Performs well in urban conditions with atmospheric pollution and tolerates a wide range of soil types. Responds well to heavy pruning and appears to show good resistance to powdery mildew and anthracnose. Best in moist, well-drained, fertile soil in full sun. Hairs on the fruits and leaves may be irritating to the nose, eyes and throat for some people. Bark, leaf and fruit litter may be a problem in urban sites.
- Size:** 15 x 10 metres.
