MOP TOP BLACK LOCUST Robinia pseudoacacia 'Umbraculifera'

A very tough 'globe-headed' standard that makes a formal specimen that can be clipped to shape. Can be planted alone or in groups in difficult areas such as small gardens, streets, malls and parks where space is restricted.

Foliage:	Soft textured, mid-green, pinnate leaves to approximately 20 cm long, turning yellow in autumn. The new growth is a lighter green creating an attractive overall contrast.
Flowers:	Rarely produced, creamy-white 'pea'-like flowers to 2 cm across.
Culture:	Adaptable to a wide range of soils and site conditions including moderate drought, heat, air pollution, poor and/or slightly saline soils and coastal areas. Prefers a moist well-drained soil and full sun. Does not like excessively wet positions. Can be pruned severely, if desired, in late summer to restrict size. Generally pest and disease free. Propagated onto <i>Robinia pseudoacacia</i> that has a propensity to sucker. The suckers have a pair of large thorns at the base of every leaf.
Size:	5 x 5 metres
