# GOLDEN LEAF EASTERN REDBUD


## *Cercis canadensis*

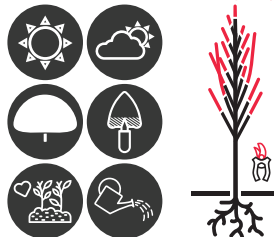
### 'Roethgold' Chain of Hearts

A wonderful golden-foliaged *Cercis* with the most distinctive large, heart-shaped leaf. It has a light habit which makes this tree perfect for smaller sized gardens. Light pinky-lavender blooms are borne on the bare branches in early spring before the leaves appear.

- Foliage:** Large heart-shaped leaves open up in spring in a wonderful golden colour, then ageing to a bright grassy green into summer. Generally exhibits brilliant yellow-orange autumn colours.
- Flowers:** Masses of small, light pinky-lavender 'pea' type flowers borne in groups along the bare branches before the leaves appear in spring.
- Fruit:** Not observed in Australia to date.
- Culture:** Suited to a wide range of soil types including acidic or alkaline. Will not withstand prolonged dry or very wet sites. Prefers a moist, deep, well-drained fertile soil. Mulch to retain moisture and lower the soil temperature during summer. Best foliage colour in full sun, but avoid hot, exposed and windy sites.

- Size:** 4 x 4.5 metres.
